**Subject:** CCSSE Assessment of our ICCs – Spring 2014 Results

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As part of the administration of the Community College Survey of Student Engagement (CCSSE), De Anza College adds additional questions to assess our Institutional Core Competencies (ICCs). The CCSSE was administered in spring 2014 to a random selection of students as an in-class, pen and paper survey. All faculty members teaching in the spring quarter are included in a pool from which the random sample of course sections is chosen. De Anza has administered the ICC portion of the CCSSE survey in 2012 and 2014.

This document disaggregates the ICC questions by ethnicity, gender and first generation status (neither parent/guardian had more than a high school education) to delve deeper into our ICCs and better understand any differences within these groups.

## **Ethnicity**

- When asked how much of their experience at this college has increased their ability to communicate their opinion or viewpoint clearly, 66% of Pacific Islander students stated very much/quite a bit, followed by 58% of Asian students and 55% of Latino/a students. (Question 7.a)

- When asked how much of their experience at this college has increased their ability to interpret ideas or issues thoughtfully and logically, 66% of Pacific Islander students stated very much/quite a bit, followed by 57% of Latino/a students, and 54% of White students. (Question 9.a)

- When asked how much of their experience at this college has increased their ability to synthesize information from various formats into a final product, 62% of African American students stated very much/quite a bit, followed by 56% of Latino/a students, and 55% of Asian students. (Question 11.a)

- When asked how much of their experience at this college has increased their ability to respect social and cultural diversity, 61% of Latino/a students stated very much/quite a bit, followed by 59% of 'Other' ethnicity students, and 51% of African American students. (Question 16.a)

### **Gender**

- When asked how much of their experience at this college has increased their ability to recognize when additional information is needed to complete an assignment, 57% of male students stated very much/quite a bit, while 64% of female students stated the same response. (Question 10.a)

- When asked how much of their experience at this college has increased their ability to recognize what is necessary to stay healthy, 40% of male students stated very much/quite a bit, while 42% of female students stated the same response. (Question 12.a)

- When asked how much of their experience at this college has increased their ability to empathize with other people's points of view, 52% of male students stated very much/quite a bit, while 57% of female students stated the same response. (Question 18.a)

- When asked how much of their experience at this college has increased their ability to evaluate conclusions to ensure they make sense, 56% of male students stated very much/quite a bit, while 59% of female students stated the same response. (Question 20.a)

### **First Generation Status**

- When asked how much of their experience has increased their ability to explore career choices and life goals, 46% of first generation students stated very much/quite a bit, while 47% of non-first generation students stated the same response. (Question 13.a)

- When asked how much of their experience has increased their ability to work effectively individually and collaboratively on projects, 53% of first-generation students stated very much/quite a bit, while 55% of non-first generation students stated the same response. (Question 14.a)

- When asked how much of their experience has increased their ability to participate in the democratic process, 34% of first generation students stated very much/quite a bit, while 35% of non-first generation students stated the same response. (Question 15.a)

- When asked how much of their experience at this college has increased their ability to understand the significance of both environmental sustainability and social justice, 48% of first generation students stated very much/quite a bit, while 45% of non-first generation students stated the same response. (Question 17.a)
